## **Cold Weather Dress**

Sweatshirts, sweaters and undershirts must be RHS colors. Any article of clothing that is a non-RHS color is unacceptable. All jackets and sweaters must be stored in your locker. Hats are not to be worn in the building and must be stored in a locker. RHS is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Articles of clothing that are non- RHS colors may be taken away and only returned upon parent pick-up.

## **RHS ID Cards**

All students and staff members must wear RHS issued photo ID cards to insure the safety of all students and to prevent trespassers from entering the building. This rule will be strictly enforced.

The ID card is necessary to enter the building, classes, to check out library materials, to enter the lunch line, to participate in extra curricular activities.

Students entering the building without a card (lost, stolen, forgotten) will be given the option of purchasing a new one for \$10 or purchasing a temporary ID card for \$1.

Students are to surrender their ID cards to any staff member upon demand. Failure to do so is an act of insubordination. Students will be subject to disciplinary action for using someone else's ID card.

## **Attendance Policies and Procedures**

Daily attendance is mandatory. There are severe consequences for truancy. Students are expected to attend every class, every day because good attendance is key to academic success. Absences occur only in cases of extreme illness or family emergency. Missing any classes without cause is considered truancy and subject to disciplinary action. Parents are contacted for every absence.

### **Excused Absences**

Upon returning to school, the student is to bring a note signed by either parent or legal guardian stating the student's full name, date, and specific reason for absence. The school will determine the validity of the absence. The student is responsible for arranging make up work with their teacher. The only valid causes for absences are the following:

- Extreme Illness
- Observance of Religious Holiday
- Death in the immediate family
- Family emergency
- Other situations will be handled on a case by case basis

### **Extended Absences**

Parents must notify the student's counselor prior to an extended absence. Documentation supporting need for absence is required.

### **Early Dismissal**

Students must be picked up by a parent or legal guardian if an early dismissal is required. Students can not be released on their own.

## **School Functions**

Students that are to be excused from any class to participate in an activity must receive permission from their class teacher prior to the event. The class teacher must sign an official field trip/permission slip. A teacher may refuse to grant permission if that student is not meeting class requirements at the time of the function. Students must be in school uniform in order to participate on a field trip unless otherwise indicated.

## **Contact Information**

Students and parents are required to keep the school informed of any change in name, address, or phone number throughout the school year. An emergency contact is required for each student in case of emergency.

## **Discipline Code**

RHS follows the Chicago Public School system's Code of Conduct. Each RHS student receives a copy of the Code of Conduct. Please see document if you have questions or concerns. All RHS students are expected to arrive on time and behave accordingly.

## **Respect of Property**

Any vandalizing, or marking of any property of the school or others, will result in arrest and severe disciplinary action. Students are not allowed to have any of the following in school: permanent or semi-permanent markers, spray paint, liquid paper, or related items. Anyone defacing property will automatically be required to pay for the clean up and restoration of the defaced property.

## **Electronics**

Students are forbidden to use the following in school: cell phones, CD players, MP3 players or I-PODS, gaming systems, or any related items. The use of these items will result in disciplinary action. If an item is taken from a student during use a parent/legal guardian will be required to come to RHS and pick up the electronic item. RHS is not responsible for any loss or damage of any personal electronic equipment.

## **Student Lunchroom Expectations**

1. RHS has a closed campus for lunch. Students are not permitted to exit the building at any time during the school day.
2. All tables, chairs and surrounding areas must be left clean
3. Throwing any objects is prohibited in the lunchroom. Anyone caught throwing items is subject to arrest and severe disciplinary action.
4. Students are not permitted to leave the lunchroom for any reason, unless a pass has been issued to attend tutoring after they eat.
5. Students are not allowed to sit on the lunch tables.
